After a four-year hiatus, the biannual World Master Swimming Championships returned to Fukuoka, Japan in early August this year with a vengeance. This swimming championship merits the equivalence to a pilgrimage in the competitive swimming world. The deeply pious swimming faithful(s) were drawn from all over the world as far as Trinidad, Peru and even India (these are not your typical swimming nations), irrespective of their speed, their age, their wealth and their race and among other factors, to congregate by the true passion for the sport.

swimming team learnt the phase "Que Fiesta Mundial de Natacion" from our Argentinian aquatic friends. And yes, when the fun loving Latin Americans called this event a party, you bet this was more than what our drab Hong Kongers can imagine. This year's a record-breaking of over 7000 aquatic tribal contenders from the five vast continents gathered at a tiny swimming stadium over the course of ten days. The multilingual cheering, frenzying and raving atmosphere in this global swimming party was simply electrifying and exhilarating. Nevertheless, it was those friendships and sportsmanship rather than the commotions and brinkmanship that epitomise the essence of this sporting event. They would stand and sit rubbing each other's shoulders in the spectators' stand(s) screaming from the tops of their lungs in their own native tongues to urge on their aquatic

tribesmen. They would also swim shoulder to shoulder in the warm up pool feeling for the same water and breathing the same air. They would also encourage and congratulate each other in whatever verbal or body language prior to the start of the race in the marshal waiting room. This epic sporting event is simply more than the four swimming strokes; it embodies the human sporting spirits and really highlights why the world is so much interconnecting and interdepending.

HKFC dispatched a very competitive team of nine that had some of the very decorated and experienced ex-Hong Kong Olympians and an ex-South Africa national swimmer to compete in more than 35 individual events and four team relay events. In swimming terms, HKFC swimming team did not sit quietly. Rather they made a hell of a racket, proclaiming and demonstrating to the world that a tiny territory with a population of about 7 million accounting

for 0.012 percent could also make an impact on the world aquatic stage.

The team had an auspicious start in Fukuoka. Leading the charge on the opening day in a pure Kamikaze fashion was our Marcus Chu and Harbeth Fu who came into a blazing 17th and 9th in their individual age groups respectively in the first individual event Ocean 3K. Ocean distance swimming races require some very different preparations and racing strategies compared to pool swimming races. Marcus and Harbeth's persistent drive for excellence was evident in their meticulous preparation(s) that earned them the reverence among the team members. Our Marcus went on to demonstrate why he is such a multitalented and diverse swimmer by achieving excellent results in two other individual pool events being 50m Free and 100m Free. The team was immensely proud of Marcus. Having come from an aquatic family full of HK and China national swimmers, our ex-HK Olympian Harbeth did Hong Kong proud by attaining 9th place in the 50m free in his age group in his subsequent individual event.

On the second day, HKFC sent **Patrick Ip**, Coach **Dominic Tsui** and **Arthur Li** to dive in the 800m Freestyle. Arthur now finally lets his actions speak louder than (his) words to exemplify why he is one the most naturally gifted world-class swimmers. The three-time HK Olympian and numerous HK record holder literally cruised to 9th place and set another new record for his age group. Arthur then went on to compete in four other individual events. The real screamer was his seventh place in 100m free style that recorded

an equal 50m 29s splits. He was so steady and patient in the race and only appeared to accelerate in the last 10m that saw him defeat all the swimmers in the race. Honestly, his racing style is so deceptive that cannot tell whether he was in training or racing. However, the real highlight was his last individual race, the 50m butterfly. This race was the first time that the team had ever witnessed him demonstrate such gritty determination in an all-out fashion to keep up with the fastest couple of swimmers in the race. FYI Butterfly is the hardest stroke of all, requiring excellent techniques and upper body and core strength. He did very well to torpedo as the top eleven 50 fly swimmer in his age group in the world. We then had our Coach **Dominic** displays an incredible determination to grind through his excruciating shoulder injury pains to sweep away his opponents in the 800m free. It was fair to postulate that Dom's fueled performance in his subsequent three individual events being the 100m free, 200m free and 50 Fly reflected his cognitive state under which Dom was subconsciously very eager to hurry back to HK to re-unite with his wife Sandy (another ex HK Olympian) who was about to give birth to their son Max. We are very proud of and happy for Dom and Sandy, and newborn Max. We all look forward to having Max to join the team in a not too distance future. The team's de facto reporter **Patrick** had bravely signed up to compete in the maximum permitted five individual events being 800m Free, 400m IM, 200m IM, 200m backstroke, 50m Free for his age group. Inarguably these are the toughest individual events with fewer swimmers competing.

Miraculously our "analgesic" Patrick with his enormous lungs' capacity managed to put in very courageous performances in all of them. He drove home the HK spirit that "Never say Never", although in hindsight he may have bitten off more than he could chew! The real highlight of Patrick's swims were his turning on his "cranky engine" in overtaking his opponents in the last 50m of these events because he knew that his children were watching him "live". Well his children are so proud of their old man!

The third day we saw the entry of the team's crown jewels Alex Fong and Craig Nortie competing in 400m IM. It was puzzling why Alex and Craig were shuffled into the same heat out of some 23 heats despite being in different age groups representing the same club. However, this did not deter Alex from emphatically proving to the world why he is still one of the top swimmers in HK by securing a very close fourth place. In fairness, the unvarnished truth is that Alex's unrelenting and demanding overnight TV shooting schedule(s) had seriously disrupted his circadian rhythm and his fatigue had been setting in. It is not easy to juggle between being a swimming star and an entertainment industry star. That said Alex must have taken a lot of solace in the presence of his loyal fan base who had trekked all the way from Hong Kong to support him. His subsequent 6th place in the 200m backstroke put some big smiles on the face of his fans. Alex is very much lionised and admired in this championship.

Our softly spoken South African native captain Craig achieved such a

humongous success in this meet. Lo and behold not only he came in with the second fastest time in the 400m IM and became the fifth fastest in 100m butterfly breaking the HK record; Craig's most remarkable feat was winning the WORLD 200m butterfly in his age group. In this epic race, he patiently bided his time and snuck up on the front leader in the last 100m and he went all out and pounced on the leader in the last 30 m. It was a classic!! The whole stadium simply erupted. He really executed his game plan intelligently with composure solidifying his position as the undisputed and undefeated champion of the world. Hong Kong must be so proud of our adopted son who is now officially recognised as the fastest middle-aged Homo sapien male flyer. Craig was very humble in his post-race analysis. He attributed his success to the night before exquisite Japanese culinary experience including some dead raw horse meat (heard the meat had come from some good part(s) of the horse), some living and breathing wriggling sea snails sashimi trying to "snog" you whilst you attempt to chew it in your month and some other unfamiliar creatures/delicacies live and/or dead whose biological nomenclature(s) that literally have no translation into English.

Our consistent never let the team down **Edmund Wan** was incredibly fast and produced excellent performances in his three individual 50m free, 100m free and 200m free events. Edmund was in his top form having tanked up his extra fuel thanks to our gourmet and nutritionist Heinrich

Grabner who meticulously arranged for the teams delicious daily Japanese dinners. However, this does not take away the credit that Edmund well deserves for having made such an improvement in the past few months and for maturing into a well-accomplished and all rounded swimmer. Edmund's performances were simply sensational. One pleasant revelation in this meet was seeing how our Heinrich, whose valiant efforts in a highly competitive 50m and 100 m free drawing and commanding the loudest applause and admiration. His gallant determination serves as a showcase to our Hong Kong people that one should never give up and always strive to do his/her very best. The team has enormous respects for Heinrich. His ultra-competitive attitudes coupled with his gentleman and altruistic sporting spirits reminds us of the true essence of these world-sporting events. Finally yet importantly, we must congratulate our 160-199 age group 4x50 freestyle relay team consisting of Alex, Craig, Arthur and Harbeth for achieving a very respectable fifth position and broke the long-standing HK record for this age group.



After winning open water races in Philippines and Bali this year, Nicolas Gontard headed to Europe in August to avoid the scorching summer in Asia and keep up with his training. While in France, Nico ioined the cross-harbour swimming race in Saint-Jean-de-Luz in France on 15th August. Nico displayed his open water prowess by taking 1st place in his AG (out of a large field of 92 athletes in the same AG). Congratulations Nico!



Vasco van der Flier and Mayank Vaid joined the Challenge distance triathlon organised by Triathlon Association of Hong Kong China. The event took place on August 26 in Plover Cove. Distances included Swim 1500m, Bike 30k and Run 8k. The swim was nice and calm but it poured on the bike and got really hot on the run. Vasco finished the course in 02:02:26 taking 3rd place in his AG. Mayank finished in 02:20:56 taking 6th in his AG.

Howard Tuckett, Headmaster at WASHK, shares his insights on what attracted the school to sponsor the **HKFC Hockey Section and discusses** the plans for growing the sport within the school community.

What attracted WASHK to sponsor HKFC Hockey Section?

We are delighted to be able to invest in helping to provide the school age children of Hong Kong with the opportunity to develop their hockey skills."

Is hockey popular at WASHK or any plans to grow the sport at WASHK?

"Actually, Wycombe Abbey in England is a renowned Lacrosse playing school! (Cover your ears hockey players)! Apart from a few obvious differences, the two games are very close, in terms of team skills, competitiveness, ball sense, fitness, agility and mental alertness.

At our campus in Aberdeen, we are very keen to start up hockey skills with our own young pupils and are thrilled to be a part of the action at this hockey club as our own pupils will also be encouraged to join the club, to support the hockey opportunities they already have at school."

How does WASHK choose sponsorships? Is there a community / social responsibility mission from WASHK?

"Wycombe Abbey School Hong Kong is quite a new school. We opened in September 2019 and almost immediately went into the severa years of lock-down that everyone in Hong Kong remembers so well.

This gave us a lot of thinking time about how we could best support the local community when life returned to normal. We decided that the area of sport, available to children of our own school's age-range, was probably the most useful area for us to focus on.

We are delighted that this opportunity to support the Hockey Club at HKFC has come up, as it aligns exactly with the opportunities we have been looking for to support the primary and junior-secondary age pupils in Hong Kong in their broader education through sport.

Sport is such a good training ground for life. The social and mental benefits, alongside the more obvious competitive and fitness achievements have a positive, life-long impact. Wycombe Abbey International is invested in youth. Sport for youth, in this case hockey, matches our ethos for educating developing youngsters exactly."

Any advice from the headmaster to kids who are starting hockey?

"I have been a Headmaster for a very long time. At my last school, some years ago, there was a little boy called Zack Wallace. I first met Zack when he was seven. Zack was a quiet and very determined little boy. Over many years I watched Zack play all kinds of sport offered by the school, and his local clubs, every week in all kinds of weathers.

On the field Zack always played his heart out. He worked hard, laughed a lot and never stopped trying. As he grew older, Zack began to focus more and more on hockey, bringing all the skills and lessons he had learned from all kinds of other sports with him.

Zack Wallace is now the regular No.7 (Wing) for both the Great Britain and the England Men's hockey teams.

Zack has received 76 international caps, 41 caps for Great Britain and 35 for England. Zack has scored 15 international goals and at the 2022 Commonwealth Games, Zack was handed the captain's armband.

You can look Zack Wallace up online. His information page is hugely impressive. However, I always think of Zack as that determined, good-natured little boy at my junior school."

Every child who comes to the HKFC Hockey Club has the same opportunities and starting place as Zack. It is our earnest hope that Wycombe Abbey School Hong Kong can offer current Hong Kong girls and boys the support to assist them to become as successful in hockey as Zack Wallace has been.

Any final words?

"To all girls and boys in Hong Kong I would say this: We often hear the line that children can grow up to become anything they want to be. Well, that is nearly true. Realising your dreams can be a bit more complicated than that. It is true to say that you should never stop searching to find your skills.

Once you have found your skills, then, that is the time to give it all you have got and go all-out to strive to be the very best at the skills that life has given you. First find out what you are good at, then strive for excellence.

To find what you are good at, you need to try, (really try), all kinds of sports, skills, interests and activities. Sooner or later something will 'click', and you will find what you are good at.

In your search for what you are good at, it is my dearest wish that each one of you will find great satisfaction, excitement and success in your hockey career ahead.


